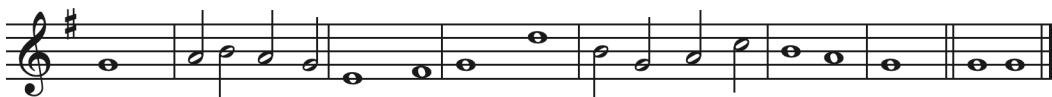

1. *Receive the Host into your hands, or directly onto the tongue.*

Receive directly from the Chalice, guiding it gently by the base.

2. *Receive by Intinction, receiving the Host into your hands and leaving it there; the Deacon will take it and dip it in the Chalice and place it onto your tongue.*

3. *You may receive only the Host of itself, either in your hands or on your tongue. Our Lord is equally present in either Form.*

As a precaution and courtesy to others and for your own safety, we respectfully request that in the event you are currently suffering from a cold or other communicable illness, please refrain from receiving from the Chalice.

For those attending remotely: Please take a moment of silence to realize the presence of Jesus Christ in your soul and make your spiritual communion.

In union, O Dear Lord, with the faithful at every Altar of Thy Church, where Thy blessed Body and Blood have been offered to the Father, I desire to offer Thee praise and thanksgiving. I present to Thee my soul and body, with the earnest wish that I may ever be united to Thee. And since I cannot now receive Thee sacramentally, I beseech Thee to come spiritually into my heart. I unite myself to Thee, and embrace Thee with all the affections of my soul. O let nothing ever separate me from Thee. Let me live and die in Thy love. Amen.

The highlights of the XXXVII Annual Synod of the Diocese of the Pacific & Southwest were: Fr David Valentini was appointed by the Bishop as Chaplain to the Military. Shannon Shehata was elected to the Standing Committee. Fr. Del McCune and Ken Kubo were appointed to the Standing Committee Fr. Del and Tori Wood were elected to serve on the Consistory Court, and Deacon Yeager was elected to serve as an Associate Judge. (The Consistory Court exists to hear charges registered against a Clergyman or Lay Person accused of violation of the Church canons (It has met only one time in its history).

The Bishop appointed Bishop Bulloch again as Treasurer of the diocese, and appointed Lisa Caravetta again as Secretary of the diocese.

The Budget for fiscal year 2024 was adopted in the amount \$17,500.

The Quarter Mite Box Offering Second Quarter of 2023 was \$61.00,
The Second Quarter Offering will be collected throughout July.

The Vestry will be on hiatus during the months of July and August.
