- 3. You may receive only the Host of itself, either in your hands or on your tongue. Our Lord is equally present in either Form.*

*As a precaution and courtesy to others and for your own safety, we respectfully request that in the event you are currently suffering from a cold or other communicable illness, please refrain from receiving from the Chalice.*

*For those attending remotely: Please take a moment of silence to realize the presence of Jesus Christ in your soul and make your spiritual communion.*

*In union, O Dear Lord, with the faithful at every Altar of Thy Church, where Thy blessed Body and Blood have been offered to the Father, I desire to offer Thee praise and thanksgiving. I present to Thee my soul and body, with the earnest wish that I may ever be united to Thee. And since I cannot now receive Thee sacramentally, I beseech Thee to come spiritually into my heart. I unite myself to Thee, and embrace Thee with all the affections of my soul. O let nothing ever separate me from Thee. Let me live and die in Thy love. Amen.*

Greater Community Missionary Baptist Church in Pacoima. This will be his 16<sup>th</sup> occasion to preach from our pulpit.

The 2024 Fourth Quarter Missionary Mite Box offering will be received throughout the month of January.

The Annual Parish Meeting will be conducted on Sunday, 26 January, in the Parish Hall following the Mass. Business to be conducted includes: election of two new members for a three year term on the Vestry, election of the 2025 Junior Warden, appointment of the 2025 Senior Warden, presentation and acceptance of the Treasurer's Annual Report for 2024, presentation and approval of the 2025 Parish Budget, and the election of delegates and alternates to the 2025 Diocesan Synod.

All are welcome to attend, however to propose or second motions or to vote, you must be a member of the Parish in good standing. To be nominated to the Vestry, you must be: 18 years of age or older, listed as a Member in the Parish Register, a Contributor of Record, and regular in attendance. Please, if you plan to nominate someone from the floor, ask their permission in advance to be certain of their willingness to serve and that they meet the Parish by-law requirements as stated.

Also: At Mass on the 26<sup>th</sup>, we will commemorate the Moving of the historic Pioneer Church to its present location in Oakwood Park.
